Dear Parent/Guardian

Warmest greetings to you. Time flies and we are now in the fourth and last term for the year. I thank you for standing by the school and staff as Safe Management Measures (SMMs) were further eased till mask-wearing is no longer required in school (from 29 Aug 2022).

2. While mask-wearing is not required, students and staff have been advised to **exercise respect for each other** as some of us might still want to wear masks to school or in school. Reasons include:

- The daily Singapore cases of COVID-19 infections and vulnerable cases requiring intensive care.
- To **stay protected** while preparing for the end-of-year or national examinations. For example, having been exposed to a household member or someone who is COVID positive.
- To be **socially responsible** when you start to feel unwell while in school and eventually seek early departure to go home to see a doctor.

Mask-wearing is still strongly encouraged when visiting crowded places or interacting with vulnerable persons to reduce the risk of catching respiratory infections.

In this period of summative assessments, we would really appreciate it if you would partner us in closely monitoring your children's/ward's work and revision schedule so that they will be sufficiently prepared. There is no denying that there would be stress during this period, so adopt a growth mindset, support them and guide them towards putting their best efforts. Examination results do not define a child. Praise them for those efforts, less the outcomes, take care of their well-being and remember to **encourage and affirm** them so that they will live up to our motto of "Be Our Best". This would go a long way in building character as well as cultivating good parent-child relationship.

As Budding Artistes and Budding Writers, Navaith Ahmed Nuha and Ramesh Buvanesh Ram of 3A4, S R Rakshita (2A6), Jaiganesh Sanjay (2A3) and Faatimah Kausar Binte Mohamed Salih (1A1) obtained a Certificate of Achievement each for their efforts.</p> <p>Bukit Batok Pen Calligraphy Competition On 2 Jul, eight S1 to S4 students were provided the opportunity to participated in a Pen Calligraphy competition organised by Bukit Batok CC and the Chinese Calligraphy Society of Singapore after their writing talents were uncovered at our BBSS Mother Tongue Fortnight Pen Calligraphy competition. Feng Shiru (2A7) attained the Second Prize in the Secondary School category whereas the other seven students received consolation prizes for their efforts. The SJPO aimed at encouraging the study and appreciation of physics beyond the school curriculum. This annual competition provides opportunities for students to solve novel physics problems that require critical and inventive thinking. Chen Xi and Ong Yan Jin of 4A7 were awarded the Honourable Mention in the individual result category.</p> <p>Creative Arts Programme (CAP) 2022 Esther Lau Jia En (3A6) was selected by Gifted Education Branch, MOE to participate in the CAP in June. Her written work has been compiled in the CAP publication.</p>
CCA (Sports)	<p>National School Games (NSG) Rugby C Div (Boys) Bowl Championship In 2019, our C Div Rugby team won the Bowl championship by beating Admiralty Secondary School in the final. Organised annually by ACS(I), the IMUNC is an educational simulation in which students can learn about diplomacy, international relations and the United Nations. At a MUN conference, students work as the representative of a country, organisation or person and must solve a problem with other delegates from around the world. MUN teaches participants skills like research, public speaking, debating, and writing skills, in addition to critical thinking, teamwork, and leadership.</p>																																																
Staff	<p>National Day Awards 2022 The Singapore National Day Awards are a means of recognising various forms of merit and service to Singapore. This year, a total of 6,258 individuals in 21 award categories received National Day Honours. The Public Administration Medal was instituted in 1963 and recipients were awarded for their outstanding efficiency, competence and industry. Mr Mak Yew Chong (VP) was awarded the Public Administration Medal (Bronze). The Commendation Medal was instituted in 1996 and recipients were awarded for distinguishing themselves through commendable performance and conduct, or significant efficiency, competence and devotion to duty. Mr Lee Chin Hock Andy was awarded the Commendation Medal.</p> <p>Listening Educator for Advancement and Progress (LEAP) Award 2022 The LEAP Award was launched by the late former President S R Nathan in 2011 and awarded by Singapore Hokkien Huay Kuan annually to recognise exceptional teachers who have made a positive impact in nurturing their students from the heart. The naming of the award signifies a leap of faith for a teacher to believe that students have the potential to excel beyond their capabilities. For 2022, 183 nominations were received from 122 schools nationwide of which Mr Nikhil Nath Chatterji was selected to be one of the 13 outstanding recipients honoured with the award. Mr Nikhil Nath Chatterji was presented with the award by the GOH, Mr Chan Chun Sing, Minister for Education at the Awards Presentation Ceremony held on 1 Sep.</p> <p>National Institute of Education (NIE) Caring Teacher Award (CTA) 2022 The NIE CTA is a biennial award that aims to acknowledge teachers in our schools who go beyond the call of duty, nurturing the holistic development of their students and ensuring their charges grow up to be confident, independent and resilient learners for our nation.
