Dear Parent/Guardian

1. It has been a week since school re-opened for Term 2. Schools have been progressively introducing more physical activities with strong Safe Management Measurements (SMM) through the directions from MOE/MOH. With the nation-wide on-going vaccination exercise and the recent announcements to allow more participants at selected events from 24 Apr, we are looking at more student engagement possibilities in future. We would like to thank all parents, guardians and caregivers in working with the school for the continued safety of the school population through taking precautionary measures like keeping their children/wards at home when they or adult household members develop flu-like symptoms.

3. While the vaccination exercise has extended to adults working in schools to further minimise transmission, I must stress that the student population remains the most vulnerable. We have continued to take strict measures in enforcing social distancing and reminding students to put on their masks at all times through the teachers and school staff deployed as Safe Management Officers (SMOs). It is a concern that some students are not practicing the necessary social responsibility and personal hygiene that has kept our school population safe since the outbreak in 2020. We urge you to work with us in continuing to educate your children/wards on remaining vigilant and responsible.

4. Each year, the school anchors on 3 student-led projects which focused on the area of Community Youth Leadership, offering students opportunities to develop their leadership character and values through serving the community. With the COVID-19 situation, we have shifted the focus towards student advocacy. Between 18 Jan to 28 Jan, student leaders and NPCC cadets have been making announcements and going to individual classes to share about Project Mi (10th year). Contactless donation of rice packets were made by students, parents, staff, Parent Support Group (PSG) members alumni, community partners and well-wishers with Willing Hearts, the charity organisation, coming on the last day to collect the rice donations that had not been sent over to them. An estimated total of 11,999 kg of rice was collected through everyone's efforts! A big THANK YOU to all! This year, No Shoe Day (10th year) was organised for the Sec 1s only by youth leaders (YLS) from the YL Executive Committee (EXCO) as an activity to meet the objective of 'Building Bonds' during the second day of Multi-Level Activities (MLA) on 29 Jan. For the 19th Blood Donation Drive on 16 Feb, the YL EXCO drove advocacy towards blood donation through level activities and an assembly programme tied to Total Defence Day.

5. Our school has integrated Home-Based Learning (HBL), known as Seek, Discover and Learn (SDL) Day on even Fridays since Term 1 Week 8 into the school curriculum. SDL Days will be a regular feature of the school experience to provide flexibility for students to practise self-directedness in planning and managing their learning, and becoming adaptable learners as learning from home becomes a reality. We have attached a Parent Kit to a Parent Gateway (PG) notification dated 27 Mar which provides general information and tips, and how you can support your child on SDL Days. Do work with us in supporting your child on those days.

6. We will continue to reduce, reuse and recycle as we create a sustainable school through Environment Education (towards zero waste). The school has built a Learning Centre that also serves as a classroom to demonstrate and showcase to our students how we can reduce our carbon footprints through lowering the ambient temperature by installing energy saving DC fans that adjust their own speed as the room cools and LED lights that provide optimal lighting as they adjust to the amount of sunlight coming into the room. The school aims to have such classrooms for all our students to enhance their learning experience.

7. Thank you for your partnership and support especially during this COVID-19 period. Have a pleasant and healthy term ahead.

The entry submitted by Rindiany Binte Zulkarnaen (4A2) is one of 25 shortlisted entries from a range of responses from many students. The 25 students will receive the SYF certificate in August in recognition of their achievement.</p> <p>On Sat, 27 Feb and on Sat, 6 Mar and Sun, 7 Mar, students from the International History Bee and Bowl (IHBB) interest group took part in the IHBB Winter League Tournament. As the competition was held online this year, the students faced competitors from across the region, including Taiwan and Seoul. In the History Bee Individual competition, Wee Jee Kit, William (4A8) and Akella Rama Santosh Srikar (3A7) did well enough to qualify for the IHBB Asian Championships that will be held in Jun this year. For the team-based Bowl competition, both BBSS Team A, comprising of William, Grace Loh Yun Tong (3A7) and Lee Shao Zhe Shamus (3A8), and BBSS Team B, comprising of Akella Rama Santosh Srikar, Siteo Yi Zheng, Linfred (3A7) and Ong Yan Jin (3A7), did well enough to qualify for the IHBB Asian Championships. Team A, led by William, also advanced to the semi-finals and achieved 4th placing in the Junior Varsity Category.</p>
