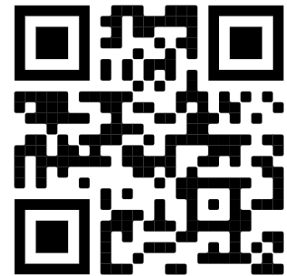

5. While the nation is taking steps towards living with the COVID-19 situation at the endemic level, we are now facing more than 1000 new COVID-19 cases daily since the end of last week. Though we have staff and students not reporting to school in bigger numbers due to COVID-19 related infections, I would share that our ringfencing approaches through updating the school on the situation regularly and reminding all to be socially responsible with the continued vigilance of appointed staff carrying out safe management measures (SMM) duties, is helping to keep the numbers manageable and rising significantly lesser in proportion to national statistics. I see this as an opportunity for students to develop and exercise the important lifeskill of self-responsibility, of being able to take care of themselves and not needing constant reminders to exercise social responsibility, practise personal hygiene and maintain social distancing.

6. Next year, in alignment to the Personal Digital Learning Programme (PDLP), 2 departments would spearhead the use of e-textbooks loaded into the students' personal learning devices (PLDs) for teaching & learning whilst lightening the schoolbag load at the same time. The e-textbooks would be available for the following subjects and would be included in the 2022 booklists for the respective levels and streams:

7. N-Level Examinations having started on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of the term itself, will be followed by the O-Level Examinations in October. With the End-of-Year Examination (EYE)<sup>1</sup> commencing from Tue, 28 Sep, this would also be a period where our students would bring forth their self-directedness and exercise what they have learnt and cultivated through our school's Habits of Mind (HOM) programme, especially the dispositions of:

- Persisting – Remaining focused in the face of challenges in their revision;
- Managing Impulsivity – Reading instructions and understanding the questions carefully at the start of examinations; and
- Striving for Accuracy & Precision – To be exact and precise, checking their work, especially examination papers again before submission.

Academic	<p>Students taking Tamil (TL) has done us proud by clinching top spots in competitions organised.</p> <p><b>Tamil Debate Competition</b> Our TL students, <b>Sivakumar Hanish</b> and <b>Govindarajan Nithya Kiruthik</b> from 3A7, <b>Venkateswaran Gayathri</b> (2A4) and <b>Thulasiraman Nikhita</b> (2A5) had won <b>1<sup>st</sup> prize</b> in this annual national level debate competition and received a \$1000 worth of Popular Book vouchers and the Challenge Shield that was presented to Mr Phua, our principal on Fri, 17 Sep.</p> <p><b>Public Tamil Speech Contest</b> <b>Sivakumar Hanish</b> (3A7) clinched the <b>2<sup>nd</sup> prize</b> in this contest organised by Tamils IT Society, Singapore in Apr where contestants presented live speeches over Zoom.</p> <p><b>Live on Festival 2021</b> Live on Festival (LOF) is organised by the National Organ Transplant Unit, Ministry of Health. LOF celebrates having participants, youths in particular, expressing their thoughts on organ donation and transplantation through art and writing, serving as a platform for exploring values of responsibility, compassion, empathy and altruism through the delicate and emotive nature of the topic of organ donation and transplantation. For the Design &amp; Essay Competition, 2 of our students, <b>Gareth Seah Ren Xiang</b> (2A6) and <b>Yuen Mann Mei Rachelle</b> (3A4) have emerged as winners for the Junior Category and Senior Category respectively.</p>
CCA (UGs)	<p><b>NCC120 12 KM Virtual Race</b> BBSS NCC (Sea) cadets and teacher officers took part in one of NCC HQ's events, the Virtual Race, where participants would need to run a total distance of 12 km each from 29 Apr to 31 Jul. The combined efforts of the cadets and teacher officers were rewarded as everyone taking part persisted over the heightened alert period and everyone had to record their runs captured on GPS using a running app and uploading the distance covered. At the end, BBSS amassed a grand total of 5,164 km. This was especially heartening as the team started late in the activity and were placed last at one point. However, everyone persisted and encouraged each other to complete at least the 12 km requirement. All the teacher officers as well as 90% of the cadets, completed the basic 12 km requirement with many exceeding the requirement many times over. The perseverance and determination paid off with BBSS NCC (Sea) placed <b>5<sup>th</sup> Nationally</b> and <b>1<sup>st</sup> among the Sea District units</b>. This was recognised and announced during the NCC 120<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebrations on 9 Sep 2021.</p>
